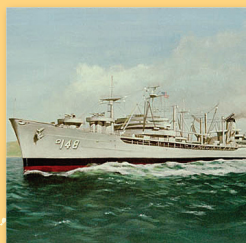


ONE-DAY *Getaway* IN TANGIPAHOA PARISH

USS Ponchatoula Memorial

Tangipahoa Parish salutes our veterans with the USS Ponchatoula Memorial. The USS Ponchatoula was a fleet oiler built to provide replenishment of fuel and cargo to US Navy ships at sea. The Memorial is dedicated to the officers and men who served aboard the USS Ponchatoula from its commissioning in 1956 to its retirement in 1992. The Memorial is a 117 scale replica of the ship's stern and contains artifacts recovered when it was scrapped in 2014. <http://www.ussponchatoula.com/>
