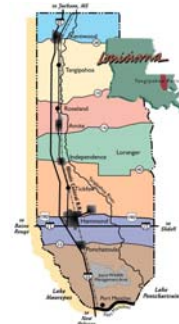




Tangipahoa Parish Louisiana
